A MAGICAL DAY AT SOI DOG'S ANNUAL BEACH WALK



A BETTER FUTURE FOR STRAY ANIMALS

Isamut had spent her life on the streets, searching for food, trusting in the kindness of strangers. But one day, her trust was betrayed. Someone, wanting to rid the neighbourhood of strays, laced her food with poison. She collapsed, her body shutting down but our rescue team found her just in time, rushing her to our hospital where she fought for her life—and won. Isamut survived, but countless others are not as lucky.

Her story is just one of many. Across Thailand, stray dogs and cats struggle to survive, facing hunger, disease, and cruelty every day. But there is a humane solution—one that prevents suffering before it begins. Through Soi Dog Foundation's CNVR (Catch, Neuter, Vaccinate, Return)

programme, we are working to reduce the number of animals born into hardship while protecting those already on the streets. By spaying, neutering, and

vaccinating, we are not only giving animals like Isamut a second chance but also creating safer, healthier communities for everyone.



WORLD URBAN FORUM

From November 4th to 8th, 2024, Soi Dog Foundation had the privilege of attending the 12th World Urban Forum (WUF) in Cairo, Egypt, hosted by the United Nations. This global event, dedicated to shaping a better urban future, brought together world leaders, policymakers, and experts to discuss sustainable solutions for communities. This year's theme, "Local Actions for Sustainable Cities and Communities," provided the perfect platform to highlight how humane dog and cat population management plays a crucial role in building healthier, safer urban environments.

As part of the International Companion Animal Management Coalition (ICAM), Soi Dog Foundation proudly presented "Paws for Progress - Dog Population Management for Safe and Healthy Cities". Our CNVR Director, Dr. Tuntikorn Rungpatana, spoke on behalf of both Soi Dog and the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA), joining a distinguished panel of global experts, including representatives from Cape Town, South Africa, and Ilfov County, Romania. These cities, like Bangkok, have pledged their commitment to humane dog and cat population management through the Positive Cities initiative.

At WUF, we showcased the success of our CNVR programme in Greater Bangkok, demonstrating how spaying, neutering, and vaccinating free-roaming dogs and cats not only prevents animal suffering but also contributes to safer, healthier communities.

We also shared insights from our Impact Assessment survey, which highlighted the strong public support for humane dog population control and discussed our achievements in rabies prevention.



BANGKOK'S COMMITMENT TO POSITIVE CITIES

A heartfelt thank you to the Deputy Governor of Bangkok, Dr. *Tavida Kamolvej*, and to the BMA for their unwavering collaboration and support throughout the years. Thanks to their leadership, Bangkok is one of the first cities to endorse the Positive Cities Pledge, recognising the government's responsibility in humane dog population management.

Soi Dog has been proud to work as a dedicated partner with the BMA, focusing on delivering CNVR

mobile clinic services in Central Bangkok. The BMA has played a crucial role in supporting our mission by providing venues, engaging with local communities, and raising awareness through online platforms. Additionally, the BMA has been running parallel free sterilisation services for dogs and cats, further strengthening humane population management in the city.

Looking ahead, the BMA is revising its ordinances on animal control, raising and releasing protocols, and animal registration to improve animal welfare. These advancements reflect a shared vision for creating sustainable, livable cities where both people and animals can thrive.





Together, we are shaping a kinder world—for animals, for people, and for generations to come.

In June, we brought you the groundbreaking news that Hanoi had issued a directive to eliminate the dog and cat meat trade and rabies across the country's capital. Since the last edition of the *Soi Dog Post*, there have been some significant developments, namely that Soi Dog became a legal entity in Vietnam.

Now, with an official office, Vietnamese staff, and the ability to foster long-lasting partnerships, this milestone draws us ever closer to our mission of ending the trade in Vietnam.

The partnership with Vietnamese state agencies to end the dog and cat meat trade has entered its most critical phase and we are expecting a successful outcome in the months ahead.



Further progress was made in December when Rahul came under the spotlight on a televised talk show covering the topic of Zoonotic diseases and DCMT eradication. The discussion centred around developing a national DCMT roadmap via enhancing legal framework to eliminate the trade in Hanoi and replicating it nationwide, highlighting the health risks associated with dog and cat meat consumption. With a primetime viewership of 3.5 million, the coverage provided a pivotal opportunity to open conversations with the wider public.

These developments demonstrate the real impact your support is making and show that together, we can achieve so much more. We look forward to bringing you more positive news from Vietnam soon.




