JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Title and Summary: The Veterinary Nurse performs patient care duties across various locations within the Phuket community; it is not a shelter-based role. In addition to basic veterinary knowledge, the Veterinary Nurse must have effective communication skills and enjoy working with animals and people.

Veterinary Nurse assists the Community Outreach Programme Manager and Team in the care of animals in need. Animal Veterinary Nurse performs an initial evaluation of the animal's condition, cleans and dresses wounds, checks vital statistics, collects blood samples etc and administers medication. He /she must be patient and possess problem-solving skills.

Veterinary Nurse is also responsible for stocking supplies, instruments and equipment ensuring that is in good working order. He/she also educates and offers advice to owners, feeders and carers of animals with the objective of improving the welfare of the animal(s) and preventing and alleviating suffering.

Key Responsibilities:

Essential Job Duties

- Administering drugs and injections following instructions from a veterinarian
- Calculating medicine dosages
- Undertaking diagnostic tests
- Administering immunizations
- Administering first aid to animals
- Recognising and responding to emergencies
- Holding and monitoring animals during examination.
- Grooming animals when needed
- Humane animal restraint during procedures and examinations
- Performs wound care/ wound dressing
- Monitors animals for any change, different from normal
- Educating the community on animal welfare and caring for animal
- Communicating effectively with other departments within the Foundation
- Assists and performs record keeping
- Distributing educational material
- Carrying out capturing/ trapping of animals
- Cleaning and maintaining instruments and equipment

- Represents Soi Dog Foundation in a positive way to the public
- As part of the Soi Dog team, is available to help as needed, even with tasks that are outside of the job description

Department and Supervisor: Community Outreach Programme and Reports to Community Outreach Programme Manager

Skills and Qualifications:

- This person should enjoy working with animals
- Be able to lift 20kg, and work in a fast paced environment.
- Ability to drive a manual truck and holding a valid driver's licence is an advantage.
- A veterinary nursing bachelor's degree and prior experience in veterinary nursing is essential.
- Basic English language knowledge is essential.

Location: Soi Dog Foundation's shelter in Mai Khao, Phuket and across various locations within the Phuket community, it is not a shelter-base role.

Type of Employment: Full-time position.
